Prior to its SEC registration, the ministry is known as the Cuenca Parish Ministry on Social Services (Cuenca PMSS). On July 18, 2023, it was officially accredited by the Municipality of Cuenca as a recognized Non-Government Organization. It serves as the Ministry on Social Services of the Parish and Archdiocesan Shrine of San Isidro Labrador and the social services arm of the Ministry on Social Services of the Archdiocese of Lipa in Cuenca, Batangas. As a social services ministry, it seeks to further nourish “Alay Kapwa” spirituality of the Cuenqueños by helping or volunteering to the programs and services towards humanitarian and environmental development through its KaSaKa thematic Programs: Kaayusan, Kaunlaran, at Kaginhawaan.

VISION

We envision socially renewed Christian communities, assisted by animated pastoral workers, through faith-based and charity-driven programs and services.

MISSION

To bring about social change towards authentic human development by promoting justice and peace, and by providing social services to the poor and vulnerable.

GOALS

- To reduce the incidence of poverty and social risks among marginalized and impoverished sectors.
- To promote and advance the Church’s social apostolate in the grassroots, in places of work and in the peripheries.
- To strengthen PMSS’ organizational capability for its effective and efficient administration of social services.


2024 ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT

(KaSaKa ni San Isidro Labrador, Inc.) is a non-stock non-profit organization duly registered at the Securities and Exchange Commission on June 16, 2023. Prior to its SEC registration, the ministry is known as the Cuenca Parish Ministry on Social Services (Cuenca PMSS). On July 18, 2023, it was officially accredited by the Municipality of Cuenca as a recognized Non-Government Organization. It serves as the Ministry on Social Services of the Parish and Archdiocesan Shrine of San Isidro Labrador and the social services arm of the Ministry on Social Services of the Archdiocese of Lipa in Cuenca, Batangas. As a social services ministry, it seeks to further nourish “Alay Kapwa” spirituality of the Cuenqueños by helping or volunteering to the programs and services towards humanitarian and environmental development through its KaSaKa thematic Programs: Kaayusan, Kaunlaran, at Kaginhawaan.

KaSaKa ni San Isidro Labrador, Inc. identifies ways and avenues to help the society in taking care of those in need, especially those in the peripheries. As the ministry scans the needs and priorities of social services throughout its existence, several factors were considered to develop the KaSaKa thematic programs and services that would further lead the parish to the people and the people to God.

The thrust of the organization focuses on the three main programs, namely: Kaayusan, Kaunlaran, and Kaginhawaan.

Kaayusan (Social Order) seeks to respond to social issues and emergencies that the community is and will be facing. The program focuses on the emergency preparedness and response of the ministry in times of calamity, protection of the environment, specifically Mt. Maculot and Taal Lake, and advocacy programs such as child sexual abuse prevention, cyber safe, electoral reforms, and mental health and psychosocial support.

Kaunlaran (Development) seeks to promote social transformation and guidance towards development to the people through youth and community development, educational assistance and scholarship program, social enterprise and livelihood training, and health and safety promotion.

Kaginhawaan (Relief) seeks to give aid and relief to the people, especially the poor and those in the peripheries, such as medical assistance and mission, food security, and support to the brethren in need (poorest of the poor families in the community).

KaSaKa ni San Isidro, Inc. 2024 Assemblies

The Parish and Archdiocesan Shrine of San Isidro Labrador Ministry on Social Services, Kasaka ni San Isidro Labrador, Inc., as a legal entity, held its general assemblies for the reorganization, formation, and planning of the ministry. Last June 16, 2024, the organized held its Midyear assembly to discuss the current state of the organization and restructure based on the comments during the Pastoral Visit of Archbishop Garcera.

Part of the midyear assembly was the workshop for the planning of projects and programs for the next year. The ministry also prepared for the World Day of the Poor.



For the Annual General Assembly, it was held last October 6, 2024 attended by the Kasaka board of trustees and officers, stakeholders from the Barangay Ministry on Social Services, and members of the organizations under the MSS of the parish. Bro. Renniel Rosales, the Executive Director of Kasaka and Coordinator of MSS, led the assembly. After giving the Director's Report, the new chairman of Kasaka, Rev.

Fr. Joselin Gonda, and the election of the new member of the board, Sis. Maria Elizabeth A. Ferrer. For the ways forward, Bro. Renniel reminded everyone about the importance of donors in our ministry especial, upon presenting the final details about the celebration of the 8th World Day of the Poor and the Pastoral Mission CAREavan 2024.



PSAC 1st Quarterly Assembly

As part of our effort to help the cause of the Ministry on Social Services of the Archdiocese of Lipa, the Parish and Archdiocesan Shrine of San Isidro Labrador Ministry on Social Services and the Kasaka ni San Isidro Labrador, Inc. hosted the 1st Quarterly General Assembly of the PSAC coordinators from different parishes through the initiative of the Lipa Archdiocesan Social Action Commission, Inc. last February 10, 2024. A welcome remark was given by Rev. Fr. Joselin Gonda, parochial vicar of Cuenca parish and shrine. An Alay Kapwa Formation, which was also a Lenten recollection, focusing on the question, “What does love look like?” was held before the PSAC Meeting and the direction given by the LASAC Director and MSS Chairman, Rev. Fr. Jayson T. Siapco.



Nurturing Synodal Leaders for Social Transformation

The Parish and Archdiocesan Shrine of San Isidro Labrador Ministry on Social Services attended the Archdiocese of Lipa Ministry on Social Services' Nurturing Synodal Leaders for Social Transformation Training Modules 1-4 last July 6, 2024 at the Immaculate Conception Parish, Balayan, Batangas. It was attended by the members of different MSS organization members from different parishes. Meanwhile, the Parish and Archdiocesan Shrine of San Isidro Labrador Ministry on Social Services hosted Modules 5-7 last August 10, 2024. This hosting is part of Kasaka's goal to support and assist the Archdiocesan ministry on Social Services.



KAAYUSAN

DRRM Orientation

Our organization joined the Archdiocesan ministry on Social Services' Disaster Risk Reduction Management Orientation to train volunteers and give insights on how parishes can help the community in disaster response. Bro. Renniel Rosales, Bro. Car Regie Vicencio, and Bro. Roderico Cuevas attended the orientation having the goal of establishing the parish control group for disaster response, especially during calamities like earthquakes, volcanic eruption, and typhoons and floodings.



Contingency Planning for the Big One

Our organization joined the Lipa Archdiocesan Social Action Commission, Inc. together with other Social Action Centers in the Contingency Planning for the Big One held on June 13, 2024 at the Minor Basilica of the Black Nazarene in Quiapo, Manila. Bro. Renniel Rosales, the Executive Director of Kasaka ni San Isidro Labrador, Inc. joined the delegates of the Archdiocese of Lipa in this noble cause. It is noteworthy that the good Archbishop Gilbert A. Garcera, DD, Archbishop of Lipa initiated this planning as there is a necessity for the Church to

also prepare for the Big One which may bring a 7.2 Magnitude Earthquake in Metro Manila caused by the West Valley Fault.

The whole day planning was spearheaded by LASAC, Inc. with LTCDR Ferdinand Juan, PN (RES) (Consultant of DRRM-CRISIS MGT- BCP), Engr. John Judilla, MNSA (Safety Director of the Ayala Property Management), and Mr. Christopher “Bong” Grajo (President of Emergency Response Integration Center [ERIC]) dealing on the Big One Impact Scenario, Snapshot of Preparedness, and Crafting Response Operations, respectively. A workshop session for the identification of the needs for each cluster of DRRM was done by the participants in the afternoon.

The Kasaka ni San Isidro Labrador, Inc. joins this preparation as part of its Emergency Preparedness and Response Program and the Disaster Control Group of the Parish and Archdiocesan Shrine of San Isidro Labrador Ministry on Social Services.



BANGON CUENCA

The Severe Tropical Storm “Kristine” (International Name “Trami”) hit majority of the Province of Batangas and affected many lives. As it hit the province, the Municipality of Cuenca experienced the severity of its impact on October 24, 2024. Many places were flooded, and a landslide happened at Brgy. Don Juan Sitio Lumampao. With this, through the initiative of Fr. Armando Lubis, Parish Priest, the Emergency Preparedness and Response Team of the Parish Ministry on Social Services Kasaka ni San Isidro Labrador, Inc. was activated to assist those who are in need.

A call for donation was made early in the morning of October 25 as the team prepared to assist the volunteers in the



landslide area by bringing food and drinks. After which, food packs were brought to houses and schools-turned-evacuation centers that sheltered the landslide survivors. Immediately after, the Kasaka Emergency Response Team went to LASAC Resiliency Center to ask for assistance such as noodles and canned goods, toiletries, blankets, clothes, and water bottles. Through the disaster fund of Kasaka, other toiletries and food packs were bought. On October 26, meals were prepared and distributed for the evacuees housed outside evacuation centers. Distribution of food packs continued and coordination with different organizations outside Cuenca was done to provide more assistance to the survivors. Among those

who supported us are individuals within Cuenca. We also received food packs from The Feast - SM Lipa Chapter. The Divino Amor Church of the Redemptorist Lipa also brought meals (dinner) for the evacuees. On the 28th, lunch was prepared and distributed at the Municipal Evacuation Center in Brgy. Bungahan, 200 meals were distributed headed by Fr. Lubis. Aside from the meals, another set of food bags were given to the displaced families. The following day, lunch was also distributed through the help of the Lipa Redemptorist Church. On the 30th, more assistance was given to different evacuation centers in Cuenca. The ministry received 70 food bags from BDO Foundation which was distributed the following day with the assistance of BDO Network Cuenca Branch.

The total amount of assistance given during the disaster response amounted to an estimated value of Php 175,220.00.

Bag the Future: Starting a New School Year 2024



The Parish and Archdiocesan Shrine of San Isidro Labrador, Cuenca, Batangas Ministry on Social Services continues its mission to give educational assistance to deserving students in the Municipality of Cuenca. The Kasaka Adopt-A-Child Scholarship Project, with its 31 scholars with some of the parents, had a Formation on Alay Kapwa last July 28, 2024. This event seeks not only to distribute the primary needs of the students for their learning but also to help them develop spiritually.

Meanwhile, last July 21, 2024, the organization in partnership with the Parish Ministry for the Youth gave educational assistance to 75 elementary pupils at Dalipit East Elementary School, Dalipit West Elementary School, Balagbag Elementary School, Ramon Paterno Memorial School, Dr. Anania Chavez Memorial School, and Balagbag Elementary School.

At the same time, we continue to sponsor our college student scholar taking up Bachelor of Secondary Education major in Religious and Values Education at Sta. Teresa College, Bauan, Batangas. Our scholar is now on her 3rd year in her course.

These activities will not be possible without the help of the generous people who assisted in the distribution and provided financial help for the two ministries.

As we celebrate the Christmas season, we did not forget the least of our brethren as the ministry distributes food bags to the poor families in Cuenca, Batangas. A total of 110 poor families were given food bags. Through the help of the Ministry for the Youth, and the Barangay Pastoral Council Ministry on Social Services, we were able to select families who deserve the gifts. This gift-giving is an annual activity of the ministry with the help of the people offering and donating goods during the Simbang Gabi in the Parish and Archdiocesan Shrine of San Isidro Labrador.

Comforting the Sick

As part of the celebration of the World Day of Prayer for the Sick, the ministry spearheaded a gift-giving activity to 20 selected sick and elderly people who belong to indigent families last February 11, 2024. This activity is part of the ministry's medical assistance. Bags of Goods were distributed together with prayer books to the beneficiaries of the activity. This activity is a post celebration of the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes.



CWL Zumba for a Cause

The Catholic Women's League Cuenca Unit initiated a Zumba for a Cause project to raise funds for the needs of the poor in the archdiocese. The project was purposely made to raise fund for the projects of the Archdiocesan Catholic Women's League and to have funds for CWL Cuenca's activities for the poor in the parish. Despite the hectic schedule for many, this activity also aims to promote healthy lifestyle through Zumba.



Municipal Nutrition Month Celebration

As part of the Kasaka ni San Isidro Labrador, Inc.'s effort to serve the community in coordination with the local government, we joined the Cuenca MSWDO in celebrating the closing of the Nutrition Month with the theme, "Sa PPAN sama-sama sa Nutrisyong Sapat Para sa Lahat" at the Pilapil Covered Court of Cuenca together with the Municipal Nutrition Council last July 31, 2024. The ministry provided a feeding activity for the attendees and organizers and distributed nutritional food packs for 26 beneficiaries who are considered severely malnourished in the municipality.



In celebrating the 8th World Day of the Poor, the spirit of sharing and giving has been central to the success of our concrete actions for the poor. This year's theme focuses on the book of the Prophet Sirach 21:5, "The prayer of the poor rises up to God". Though this theme prepares us for the Holy Jubilee Year of Hope, our action for the poor is always visible as the poor's prayer is a hope for them to be seen and heard in times of difficulties. As we reflect on the message of Pope Francis for this year's celebration, we remember not only the prayers of the poor but also the situation they are into.

Despite the call of the Archdiocese to divert all our activities for the survivors of the STS Kristine, the Parish and Archdiocesan Shrine of San Isidro Labrador proceeded with the planned activities since we are still continuously helping the survivors through the help of many people and organizations. We heed to the call of Pope Francis "in every circumstance to be friends of the poor, following in the footsteps of Jesus who always began by showing solidarity when dealing with the least among us."

Serving the Brethren in Need

In the main celebration of the World Day of the Poor on November 17, 2024, the ministry distributed food bags to 50 poor families from different Barangays in Cuenca with the help of the Social Services coordinators in the barangay chapels. Bags of goods were also given to the identified poor families that the Catholic Women's League Cuenca included in the poorest families list.

Poverty Meal

To be closer to the poor, Rev. Fr. Armando Lubis and Bro. Renniel Rosales dined with a chosen poor family. This meal is not only a way to feel the stomach of the beneficiaries but also to assist them in their needs. By listening to them, the ministry has identified ways to help them such as assistance to avail sacraments for the children and including them in the list of school supplies assistance every year.

Free Community Legal Consultation

In coordination with St. Thomas More Association of Lawyers for Transformation (SALT), Inc., the ministry provided free legal consultation to the people. Headed by Atty. Ramel Muria, the president of SALT, Inc., and four SALT lawyers, the consultation has been a success for all.

In celebration of the 8th World Day of the Poor and early celebration of the Feast of Our Lady of Miraculous Medal, secondary patroness of the parish and shrine, the Pastoral Mission CAREavan 2024 was held in Brgy. Emmanuel, Cuenca, Batangas. There were 100 family beneficiaries, most of the beneficiaries came from Sitio Pulong Gubat and were chosen with the assistance of the Brgy. Emmanuel BPC. It was held on November 23-24, 2024 at the Emmanuel Covered Court. The first day of the CAREavan is the evangelization day where the beneficiaries listened to different topics. The different talks focus on the background of Pastoral Mission CAREavan and Alay Kapwa Spirituality by Bro. Renniel Rosales, MSS Coordinator; Basic Catechesis given by Sis. Marina Robles of the Committee on Catechesis; Mental Health and Psychosocial Support by Dr. Jovine Cuevas, the Kasaka focal person on MHPSS program; and Family and Service by Bro. Poly Carandang c/o CWL.

On the second day of the CAREavan, a Eucharistic celebration was held presided by Fr. Armando Lubis. It was followed by the distribution of food bags for 100 families. A soup kitchen was also prepared for breakfast for 300 people. The medical mission was the highlight of the celebration where volunteer doctors, nurses, and barangay health workers. The different organizations under the ministry on social services (PSAC, CWL, PPHCV, BPC Social Services coordinators) spearheaded the CAREavan. Through the help of different individuals and organizations, the celebration, indeed, has become a great success for all, serving 180 individuals.





Financial Report




